Dear Fellowship Partners,

Many of you know that I've been connected with PF since 1989, when, as a young nineteen-year-old, I sought help for my struggles with unwanted and unasked-for same-sex desires. In the years since, I've not only diligently pursued my own healing, but have responded to God in the mission of "... binding up the brokenhearted and proclaiming liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners" (Isaiah 61:1).

I am grateful to see God move in the hearts of his people as he leads them to Portland Fellowship. These men and women are embarking on their own journey toward healing in our *Taking Back Ground* program. As you read our newsletter each month, you may find what we do interesting without realizing the monumental step each one makes when they decide to leave homosexuality. Few men and women in today's society go against the cultural tide and choose to fight against their fleshly desires and follow the Lord and His righteousness. I am very excited for each of these brave new participants and pray they will embrace everything God has for them.

This summer was incredible. The Sy Rogers Seminar held at Trinity Fellowship Church was powerful. Two hundred people attended the Saturday seminar and an additional one hundred young men and women were encouraged to "stay clean in a dirty world" by Sy. When so many of us feel guilt-ridden and condemned by our struggles, Sy helped put things into

One chapter in the program is entitled, "An Adventure to Live".
