One of the most exciting aspects of living the Christian life is having a front row seat to view God's unfolding plan. I've had plenty of opportunities to see God accomplish his will in both natural and supernatural ways, and it is always amazing. Sometimes He surprises us with gifts. Other times He reveals his plan by placing it in our hearts and inviting us to prayer and generosity.

One Thursday afternoon in 1991, I went to talk with Phil Hobizal, the founder of PF. We met at the office located in the Hinson Annex to talk about my involvement on the ministry team. It was a

beautiful day, so we decided to take a walk around the neighborhood. We went no more than a block when Phil stopped, looked up at a big run-down house, and said, "See that house Jason. I believe God wants Portland Fellowship to have this house and I'm praying God will give it to us." I remember chuckling, thinking Phil was just a big dreamer.

He was a dreamer and I am extremely grateful for it. What seemed like an impossibly came to reality when Hinson invited us to rent the house for only \$600 a month! I remember moving in. It was exciting and somewhat overwhelming. The house was a mess. One person was living in the 5,200 square foot home and seemed to be moving from room to room as he messed them up. We had to clean the rooms, pull up orange shag carpet, take down florescent lighting, and slap gallons of paint on the walls. It was well worth it.

Over the years, the house continued to be transformed. We restored the floors, renovated the rooms, and put a lot of tender loving care into the house. Hinson restored the roof, the siding, and gave the exterior a miraculous

face life. The third floor, which had become a

graveyard for over a hundred pigeons, was turned into beautiful living quarters for four interns. I look at old pictures and hardly recognize the place.

In 2003, Hinson came to us with the offer to purchase the house. We were now in the process of undergoing our largest fundraising project to date. I was excited and a bit overwhelmed, but Phil's words reminded me that God desired us to have the house. Through the generous support of the Murdock Charitable Trust, special private donors, supporting churches, and the many who pray and support PF each month, we succeeded in raising the amount needed to call this place our
