Having children has always been a huge desire of my heart. Even as a teen, I desired to be a father, but believed that my struggles with same sex attraction would exclude me from this possibility. I'm tremendously thankful that God is bigger than our struggles, doubts, and fears. And not only so, but he fulfills the desires of our hearts.

There is a risk in sharing how God took me from confusion with same-sex attraction to being married with a family, as I could make it appear that marriage is the goal of the healing we seek. I've always said that being married or having a family is not proof of healing, but rather can be a blessing of it. And God has blessed me in this way, by taking me from a life of uncertainty, hopelessness, and confusion and turning it into something wonderful and beautiful. God is good. I can not help but share this story of my transformation with the world. And this past August I had the opportunity to do just that by going to Quito, Ecuador.



My time in Ecuador was remarkable. A sister ministry of Portland Fellowship, Camino de Salida (The Way Out), hosted an international conference titled "From Carbon to Diamonds". I taught eight times (with a translator) during the three-day event. After the conference I spent another three days training leaders from several countries. In-between these two planned items, I was given the opportunity to share our work on four different radio programs, and spoke to a politician about the importance of loving those who are gay and lesbian as he seeks to uphold morality in his country. Although all these activities were great, the deeper memories will be of the people. For starters, I was joined by two former interns, Jimmy Di'Agosta and Jeremy Gordon-Smith. We were involved in plenty of active ministry, but when free time was available, the three of us would take on Quito together. Jeremy was especially helpful as he spoke Spanish fluently. This helped me with bartering, counseling, and ordering a burger with fried banana on it.

Another benefit of my trip was to meet the men and women of *Camino de Salida*, a ministry Portland Fellowship has been financially supporting for many years. Two years ago, Jeremy translated our *Taking Back Ground* material into Spanish. Before we left to Quito, we decided to present them with a couple boxes of these manuals. They were grateful for the gift and asked that I pass on their gratitude to you, our partners that helped make this all possible. The people at *Camino* are wonderful people doing a great work, and if you are looking to expand your tithes and offerings to ministries abroad, please consider *Camino* or similar ministries in Latin America.
