Occasionally, I have moments where my emotional response to something takes me by surprise. I'll be minding my own business playing with my daughter, talking to my wife and then some commercial comes on TV. Now, it could be any sort of advertisement. It doesn't really matter what product it is, but something in the commercial touches a universal truth, some shared emotional experience, and as a result, here come the tears. Sure, you **know** that you are crying over a fabric softener commercial, but you can't help it!

For me, my most recent experience of this did not come at the hand of crafty advertisers, but through one simple question. As I was leaving church last week, I had a chance to talk with a friend about the ministry of Portland Fellowship. Somewhere near the end of the conversation, the young woman asked: "Where does Portland Fellowship receive its funding?" I was not prepared for my emotional response.

Let me give you a little context. Every year in January, Portland Fellowship's staff and board of directors meet for our annual planning meeting. It is in this meeting that we, among other agenda items, review our budget from last year and set our budget for the year to come. Although crunching numbers has never been one of my favorite activities, each year this seemingly tedious task takes on a more profound meaning for me. I become wonderfully confronted and comforted by God's faithfulness to this ministry.

Our annual planning meeting was just a few days prior to my friend's question; and, having all the numbers of our budget still floating around in my head, I am sure that I could have very easily and systematically recited every detail of where our funding comes from. That, however, was not my response. I managed to get out a few intelligent words before getting choked up. I remember thinking, "What is wrong with you! Just complete a sentence!" Numbers were not coming to mind- names and faces were. Portland Fellowship's financial partners do not simply represent a transaction that happens, but rather a relationship and a history that comes in with each gift of support. Each gift is a parent's hope and belief in the God who transforms lives, or it is an offering of gratitude of a life that has been changed, or the affirming support of the family of faith to continue doing a ministry that so few others have the platform to do. There is a lot more than just a check to be cashed in each envelope. How could I even begin to explain that? I have a hard enough time just taking that in for myself...how do I share that with others?

It truly is amazing what we get to do here. Every week we watch as God moves among us changing lives, healing wounds, instilling hope, and restoring marriages. It is amazing to watch. Sometimes the process is beautiful, sometimes it is an absolute mess...but in all of it, the
