Dear Fellowship Partners,

I first learned about the ministry of Portland Fellowship in 1995 while working at the Starbucks on Hawthorne across the street from the Fellowship House. Jason, along with John Paulk (former staff member) and Phil Hobizal (ministry founder) used to come in for coffee on a regular basis. I don't recall our first conversation about PF, but over time I became intrigued enough about the ministry to want to learn more. Early on, I began my support of PF by giving them my weekly pound of coffee for their office, then I started making small, irregular donations.

Over the time that I worked at that location Jason and I became friends and through that


relationship I learned more about the history and vision of the ministry. I was excited to hear about an organization that was reaching out to and supporting people struggling with homosexual feelings. Churches have come a long way, but for many years they haven't seemed to know how to support someone in their congregation struggling with this issue. I knew that I wanted to support a ministry that was providing a safe, Christ-centered solution to an issue that had so much controversy and stigma attached to it.

My wife Rachel and I attended one of PF's annual seminars where we learned about how broken family relationships so clearly contribute to the establishment of homosexual feelings. We listened to a professional counselor explain how a child's legitimate need for closeness with, and acceptance from their same-sex parent can become sexualized if they enter into adolescence with that need unfulfilled. And most significantly,


we heard amazing testimonies of how God changed broken lives through the ministry of Portland Fellowship. We heard from young women who felt lost and rejected by God because of sexual feelings that they didn't ask for or want; and, from men who had felt the emptiness of pursuing a life given over to "sexual freedom." These same men and women now spoke of lives transformed and hope restored. They spoke of how God gently led, guided, or carried them into Portland Fellowship and how He faithfully walked with them as they began the hard work of surrendering themselves to Him daily. It was the testimonies that sold me on PF, because each person that shared confirmed that PF made room for God to do the work, and for Him to receive the glory.

Over the last fourteen years I've been a financial supporter of Portland Fellowship because I've seen the fruit of God's love and faithfulness in the testimonies of those who have gone through Taking Back Ground or who have attended the Wives' Support Group. I can't get enough of those stories. I read every issue of newsletter and am awed by the courage of the participants/authors and awed by the transforming power and love of Christ.

Besides Taking Back Ground and the other support groups at PF, I've been impressed with the creative resources they've developed to spread the ministry beyond the walls of The Fellowship House. Seven years ago they developed The Map, an interactive CD Rom that allows a young struggler to access materials similar to Taking Back Ground and go through it with a trusted mentor. Always looking for more opportunities to bring healing to strugglers, PF developed "reachtruth.com". Reachtruth is a web-based platform that updated The MAP for a wider audience with easier accessibility through the internet. It allows people to work through the materials with



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a mentor and provides increased interaction, weekly devotionals and feedback for each question they answer. Groundbreaking! Jason reported recently that there are now over 200 Reachtruth participants working through the material, each with a mentor! That is hundreds of people that may not have been able to find the kind of support PF offers where they live!

Let me tell you about one more thing I love about Portland Fellowship: they're frugal! What they can accomplish with the support they receive is amazing. Believe me, I'm on the Board of Directors and I get to see how they spend their money. There are over 50 participants that attend Taking Back Ground each Tuesday during the program year. Additional support is provided for wives, friends and family, men living with HIV/AIDS and weekly discipleship and training provided by the staff. Portland Fellowship now has sister ministries in Albany, OR, South Korea and Ecuador! The reach of Portland Fellowship is now literally global! Thanks to a wonderful group of committed volunteers, Portland Fellowship is able to accomplish this and more with only TWO AND A HALF paid positions!

A few years ago Jason asked me to join the Board of Directors. Since joining, I've had more opportunities to see PF in action and to hear more of the moving testimonies of how God has transformed lives, given hope, restored marriages, healed wounds, and ministered to brokenness. I enjoy feeling a part of God's work there through my participation on the board and through my financial support. I encourage you to find a way to be involved. It can be as simple as attending an Open Group night, or the graduation ceremony at the end of Taking Back Ground; or you can call the office and ask how you can volunteer. I know you will be blessed if you do. And please, continue to support Portland Fellowship financially. Your gift will continue to bear great fruit.
