Dear Fellowship Partners,

The men and women who come to Portland Fellowship set a high standard of faith for all of us. They may not feel like they are being courageous, but when people come through our door seeking help for shameful sexual and relational sin, they are not unlike those men and women who came to Jesus for healing. They came not asking much; just that He would touch them. And he marveled at their faith. I marvel at the faith of our participants.

I also realize that every aspect of this ministry must be grounded in strong faith: a trust that God will hear the cries of His children and once more move to meet the broken heart with his healing touch. It is by faith that we accept God's protection over our ministry – our house, our leaders, and our leaders' families. It is by faith that we need to make our decisions about the future, and to boldly reach further and further into our broken world with the message of sexual redemption.

It is also by faith that we must receive God's provision for this ministry. My dad (I now again call him Dad, not Jim, as he is no longer my employee), is often quoting an old missionary saying, "God's work done in God's way will have God's provision." That makes sense. And it follows, that if we ask our participants to have faith in God, we, who direct this ministry, must also do our work by faith.

The recent changes in the economy have affected PF in a number of ways. Some of our volunteer leaders have lost part or all of their income. Many of our participants are experiencing financial stress, and these stresses show up in their prayer requests and in the weekly reports they make in their small groups.

PF has also experienced a marked drop in monthly income. We, like so many others, need to bear the common burden of "tightening the belt" and doing the most we can with every precious gift. This is especially difficult, however, for a ministry where personnel costs represent the majority of the budget. As director, I see behind every "line item" the realities in our staff members' lives – their housing costs, their children, and their ever-increasing health care – the same needs most of you struggle to meet. So what to say?

I believe the answer lies in faith; and in faith is *vocation* – what is God calling us to do? How is He asking us to trust Him? What is the step (if not *leap*) of faith that He is asking of us. If God has called PF into being, and continues to call men and women to come here for healing. If we are doing this work in a way in which God approves, then we must trust that He will provide all we need.

We must also trust that you, our supporters will hear God's call and respond in the same faith. And that is what I would request of you – all I would expect – I'll ask it boldly: live by faith.

It might be helpful to know that PF continues its ministry through a large number of relatively small gifts. With thousands of people getting hungry, and only five loaves of bread and two fish, it seemed impossible to feed them all. Yet *by faith*, Jesus, looking to heaven gave thanks and began passing out the food until all were satisfied and, remarkably, twelve basketfuls were left over.

What a God we serve! A faithful God, who accomplishes everything He sets out to do. Thank you for being a part of this amazing work and thank you for your faithfulness in Christ our Lord.
