Dear Fellowship Partners,

Discipleship is a risky undertaking. Making the decision to help people mature spiritually and grow more and more into the likeness of Christ is a task that will require more of you than you can ever predict, bring heartache and frustration beyond what you can expect, and bring more satisfaction and joy than almost anything else on earth. It is no wonder to me why it was the last instruction that our Lord left with His disciples; to go into the world and make more disciples... It truly is the Great Commission.

Discipleship is at the heart of everything that we do here at Portland Fellowship. Every program, every speaking engagement, every counseling appointment, has the same aim, to help people grow in maturity in Christ and become a more accurate reflection of His image. The context of discipleship may change, whether that is through our Taking Back Ground program, through the internet with reachtruth.com, with hurting family members at The Hope Group, or through the very unique and intense live-in discipleship program The Upper Room, the end goal is always the same.

For our readers who may be unfamiliar with the Upper Room Program, every year men and women come to Portland Fellowship and live together in community for nine months, participating in teaching and mentoring geared towards continued emotional and relational healing, spiritual disciplines, and leadership development. Every year the community that God brings together is unique in its

personalities and needs, but every year this program provides a front row seat to the amazing work of healing and redemption that the Lord is famous for doing around here. This year was no different.

Last September six men began this discipleship journey, coming to PF from as close as Portland and Salem, and as far as Alaska and Brazil. In the first few weeks, as they shared their histories and testimonies with each other, it became clear why God had brought each of them to this program. There was an incredible amount of pain represented in our little community, and as God began to address the wounds and injuries of each man, the cost of discipleship became more and more apparent. I have watched as each of these men make difficult choices to follow Christ; choosing to trust the character and heart of God when the evidence and history of your life would compel you to doubt His character and His plan.

To say that this year was without pain or heartache would be a lie. We started this year with six Upper Room participants, and we ended this year with five. Along our journey one of our men made a decision to remove himself from the community. This was a very difficult moment for each of us in the Upper Room. The reality about our programs here at PF, and any discipleship for that matter, is that confronting your sin and immaturity and conforming to the image of Christ is incredibly difficult. Every year people drop out of each of our programs, and every time it is difficult to experience. That is where the heartache of discipleship comes in. When people abandon the journey it is only human nature to wonder what more could have been done to help the

person continue in the process. I recently received some wisdom on this from one of my Professors at Multnomah Bible College. I was sharing with him my feelings of failure and frustration over losing this participant when my Prof. reminded me that out of the twelve that Christ called to discipleship, only eleven persevered. Even Christ himself experienced the loss of a disciple.

A second piece of advice that my Professor gave me was to celebrate the successes. This is where the satisfaction and joy of being a discipler comes in. We may have lost an Upper Room participant this year; however, those who have stayed have been consistently and courageously surrendering their lives to Christ. It has been remarkable to see the healing and maturity that these men are walking into after only a short period of time. It would be fair to say that for some of them, it is almost as though they are discovering for the first time life beyond brokenness. It is awesome to see the recognition of healing taking place and the unfolding of new possibilities for these men. The journey is not over for any of them, but too see how each has responded to the Lord over the last nine months, gives me great hope that each will continue to experience freedom and healing in the Lord.

As we close out this program year we are already processing through applications for next year's Taking Back Ground and Upper Room programs. Each one of those applicants represents another eternal soul who is engaging in the process of becoming more like Christ. If experience has taught us anything here at PF, we know that this process will be difficult, and yet incredibly glorious. We know that not all who start will finish. We know that we will be stretched as we walk alongside the brave men and women, and finally we know that we will be doing what Christ has asked His followers to do, what we have devoted our lives to -making disciples of Jesus. Please join us in praying for those who are walking this journey, for those who have abandoned the journey, and for those yet to start!
