The sheer volume of information available today, and the speed at which it is available and can be distributed, is unlike that of any time in human history. This rapid distribution of information, seems to be picking up momentum, widening the gap between a Biblical world view and “The World’s View” at an ever-faster pace. Materialism, vanity, self-centeredness, and godlessness are often portrayed as virtues! Restored Hope Network

Networking is a vital aspect of the ministry we do. It is not only vital for those seeking help, but for those serving as leaders to connect with one another for support, encouragement, sharing of resources, and prayer. On September 21, a group of leaders from around the country came together in Sacramento, California, to help complete the formation of the 'Restored Hope Network'.

This is only the infant stage of what we hope becomes a dynamic, nationally recognized, and utilized ministry network. Some of the important tasks to work on include the completion of the bylaws, doctrinal statement, member ministry requirements and process. This will take time, but the newly formed board is hard at work to develop a strong, compassionate, and Biblically grounded network.

Jason Thompson was elected as one of the seven board members. Other members include: Andrew Comiskey (author of the Living Waters Program) from Desert Stream Ministries; Robert Gagnon, professor at Pittsburg Theological Seminary; Anne Paulk, author of "Restoring Sexual Identity"; David Kyle Foster of Mastering Life Ministries, (the television ministry behind *Pure Passion*, a television program); Stephen Black, founder of Oklahoma City-based First Stone Ministry; and Ron Smith, director of New Hope Ministry.

The desire is for Portland Fellowship to move toward membership in the Restored Hope Network, but currently the network is still in the formative stages. Please pray for this continued process, that we all seek the Lord's wisdom and leading.
