Some people love change. They are energized by fresh faces, new routines and different challenges. As for me, I enjoy familiar faces, somewhat predictable outcomes and the refining of what already works well. As such, when I came back from vacation this past summer and heard some big news that would include a significant change at Portland Fellowship, my heart stopped for a moment. Yet, I am confident in the Lord's leading and blessing as we say goodbye to one of our beloved staff members, Drew Berryessa.

Almost 15 years ago, Drew came into my office wanting to learn how to "help others" with this issue of homosexuality. It wasn't but a week later when he came back admitting that he himself needed support in this area of his life. Before I met him, Drew had already surrendered the idea of pursuing same sex relationships, but his desire in coming to Portland Fellowship was to invite the Lord into deeper areas of his heart and allow the Lord to transform his life.

Drew holds the distinctive honor of being one of the first interns in the Upper Room Community. It was in that newly formed program where he tackled many of his emotional and relational wounds. He then went on to volunteer as a small group leader and soon thereafter became a staff member.

Drew and I have gone through many different roles in our relationship. He came in as a participant and is now leaving as one of my closest friends. We have been through the joys and trials of ministry together, and we have blessed and encouraged one another, both in our personal lives and in the lives of our families.

Because of his intentional commitment to press into the healing process and give back all he has learned, Drew has become my favorite transformational story in all my years of serving at Portland Fellowship. I am deeply grateful that the Lord brought Drew into my life and that we've been able to serve together for more than a decade.

Drew has not only blessed my life, but has blessed the lives of countless others through Portland Fellowship. The following reflections are from just a few of those who have been lovingly impacted by Drew:

"Years ago, Drew and I both worked at the same phone company. I felt camaraderie with him even back then, knowing we shared the same heart for ministry.
