Dear Fellowship Partners,

I recently had the privilege of joining other board members of the Restored Hope Network for our annual retreat on the Oregon Coast, where we took time to pray and plan for the year ahead. As I sat in the beach house overlooking the majestic Pacific Ocean, I was once again reminded of how God's unmatched power and comforting peace is available to us in an increasingly confused world. These two attributes of God were a needed and timely reminder as various reports came to our attention.

It was not a surprise to us that the Gay Christian Network (GCN) was holding its annual

conference in Portland the same weekend as our retreat. What we were not prepared for was the news that some of our friends and acquaintances were attending the event and were adopting a gay identity. At the same time, we also learned that the vice president of the now-defunct Exodus International had declared himself gay.

I can understand why there is an advancement of 'gay Christians' in our churches. The personal struggle can feel deeply overwhelming, and a sympathetic organization offering to meet a lonely person's legitimate need for community can be very appealing. The attempt to hold to their Christian faith while embracing their same-sex desires as natural and good makes this community—the GCN—very attractive. It is, however, a community counterfeit to God's plan and purpose.

When deception and distorted beliefs begin to take root, they produce false identities. The GCN uses the terms Side A and Side

B: Side A believing that homosexual unions are blessed by God, and Side B believing that these unions are prohibited by God, but holding on to a gay identity. Both groups, it appears, allow their *feelings* to determine their identity, rather than God's Word.

Along with the expansion of the GCN, an increasing number of pastors, writers and teachers who—while teaching a biblical model of sexual conduct—are assenting to the concept of a "celibate gay" identity. This position indirectly communicates the impotence of God to change, restore and transform the person struggling with same-sex attraction. In previous newsletters, I have addressed why a "celibate gay Christian" identity is both problematic and unbiblical. More to the point, putting any worldly adjective before your identity in Christ places Christ second to one's self-perception. Can we speak of a "gluttonous Christian", an "adulterous Christian" or a "gossiping Christian"? No! Our identity must be foremost in Christ who has the power to transform our lives to conform to His (2 Corinthians 3:18).

For the sake of clarification, Portland Fellowship subscribes to neither Side A nor Side B. The only label we need is that of a follower of Christ. Our identity is not found in our sexuality, emotions, temptations or failures. Our identity is found in our relationship with Jesus and our submission to Him.

As I shared in the opening of this letter, I am in need of God's power and peace more than ever. There can be a tremendous amount of discouragement for those seeking to surrender their sexuality and their identity to Christ, so we must remind one another to stand strong and faithful. 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I deeply appreciate what David wrote in Psalm 37 regarding our response to the world around us:

If you are not sure how to navigate these strange new waters, or you are

disheartened and discouraged by the events of our times, reflect upon and live these words of the psalmist: fret not; trust in the Lord; delight in the Lord; commit your way to the Lord; refrain from anger; be still and wait patiently. And as the author of Hebrews shared, "Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2).

Portland Fellowship continues to be a light on the hill (Matthew 5:15), and we are deeply grateful that you stand with us in friendship, encouragement, prayers and support.
