Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you resting in the peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is a high calling to find peace in a culture that challenges us at every angle. No matter what our background is, we are forced to grapple with something in our environment or in our relationships that challenges our security, our identity and what we really believe.

I've had my own share of challenges to contend with. I am a child of the 60's, raised in a typical dysfunctional home, found salvation at the age of twelve, attended a Christian university, married then raised four daughters, homeschooled for twenty-two years, semi-conservative...divorced. From my own abbreviated story, you can already see that I have had my own issues to grapple with. What do I do with my childhood baggage? What does God think of divorce? Where do I find my value and my identity?

In addition to these questions, our culture challenges us even further—Why marry? Why hold onto our values or convictions? Wouldn't it be easier to just live for today and enjoy pleasure? I have to say this because I feel very strongly about it: I think it can be better than that. I think that often what the world calls "pleasure" is really satan whispering, "Just

take a bite." I think when we are challenged, it forces us to really face what we believe in our core—whether we are going through a divorce, facing unemployment, broken relationships, sexual identity issues, overwhelming loss or cultural pressures to conform—each of us is forced to respond in some way, either proactively or passively. Will we choose to believe what God's Word says about His love for us, and our identity being found in Him, or will we listen to other whisperings? I believe that if our feet are not firmly planted in the Truth of God's Word, we will be easily swayed.

I have seen how Portland Fellowship holds fast to Scripture, with so much integrity, even in the midst of a very challenging secular culture and a "sometimes confused" church culture. My personal connection with PF initially came through friendship with Jason and Amy Thompson. However, my love for the mission of PF has come through witnessing how boldly and unapologetically the Truth is proclaimed. Several years ago, I began doing some proofreading and editing for their newsletters. As a self-proclaimed "grammar geek", I thought it was fun to help with spelling corrections, etc. But, what ended up happening surprised me. Time after time, I would find myself being moved to tears as I read the testimonies contained in The Fellowship Message. These were stories of men and women's lives being transformed by God through discipleship at PF. Their stories deeply touched my heart. I have always loved reading biographies, especially to learn how people grapple with life's challenges. How do they survive? What helps them to overcome? It was in these newsletter stories that I saw one constant theme—a grappling of where people would choose to find their identity, and a turning to the Lord to follow and cling to Him.
