

Dear Friends, update october 2023

This month marks eleven years since I first began my discipleship journey at Portland Fellowship. Like many Christians who secretly struggle with unwanted same-sex attraction or gender confusion, I had successfully kept my internal conflict hidden for years. I was actually serving as a missionary in another country when everything fell apart—I almost had a sexual fall with another man, and I

Thankfully, through a connection with my home church pastor, I found Portland Fellowship. It was incredible! Here was a ministry where brave men and women were openly wrestling through their deepest desires, wounds and doubts. As someone who had never personally experienced such a vulnerable and truth-filled community, I was both terrified and full of hope: If God could do a healing work in these people's lives, maybe He could do the same for me!

could no longer avoid my struggle.

As I look back on how the Lord met me in those early years of Taking Back Ground and the Upper Room Community, I am overwhelmed with gratitude. There were so many lies, wounds, fears and doubts I had to process, yet God patiently provided me with amazing mentors and healthy church friends who spoke truth and grace into the wounded areas of my heart. It wasn't a switch that was flipped, but over time, the Lord slowly began to heal and restore my identity, my security

in my masculinity, and my relationships with both men and women. And His healing work continues to this day! "...being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."—Philippians 1:6

God also provided for me financially throughout my discipleship process here at PF. I was struggling to find a job, but I was also dealing with culture shock (Portland is definitely weird!) and the shame I felt confronting my unwanted same-sex attraction. Now, how did God provide for me financially? Was it through an inheritance? Savvy financial investments? A hugely generous one-time gift? While those would've been amazing means of provision, God instead sustained me through faithful, sacrificial monthly supporters.

These brothers and sisters intentionally came alongside me and diligently gave towards God's work in my life. At the time, this was hard for me to accept—I wasn't out here evangelizing on the streets or working in ministry. I was just a broken, unemployed Portland transplant who was trying to follow Jesus and surrender my life to Him. And as embarrassed as I was to receive help (because I had nothing to "show" for it), today I am so thankful for those people's sacrifice, investment and trust in God's work in my life.

Fast-forward eleven years: I'm now on staff here at Portland Fellowship, but the Lord's provision remains the same. We continue to be amazed at how God provides for our needs as a ministry through the sacrificial, consistent giving of people like you. Every month, we see so

One of our Taking Back Ground alumni, Mark* (name changed for privacy), recently shared this with us:


