

Dear Friends, update april 2025

As I look back at our March Portland Fellowship retreat, I am still processing what happened. Every year, though the retreat follows a similar format, there are things that will always be different: the people and the stories they bring, their life experiences they recount to you, how they found PF, and why they are there. There are so many memories built in these times when we share our differences with one another. I hold these moments close, as they are unlike any other.

There are things at the Taking Back Ground retreat that don't change either. One thing that remains the same is the Lord. He is faithful to show up and constant in His presence there. He can be especially sensed during the Surrender Service time, when His heart is moved by the things that are laid down to make room for more of Him. This year, we saw the confessions of wounded souls seeking healing and wholeness touch His heart. We heard Him in the sound of bitter weeping as someone grieved giving up the one thing that was supposed to bring hope, only to find out it was a lie. Jesus was right there with them at the altar. These are the things that change me.

On the lighter side of the Surrender Service, this year a participant from Texas (with that Texan accent) was recounting his time of learning at PF. As he shared, he said he had a "mental sunrise" from the Taking Back Ground material. Laughter erupted! This participant has a way of telling what he hears from the Word that you can't help but laugh out loud. Even though his surrender was serious, he has a special gift of spreading joy.

Another example of something that doesn't seem to change at the TBG retreat is the time of fellowship and getting to know each other to a greater depth. Sometimes it is during conversations that the discovery of another's heart changes yours. Other times, it's playing a game and laughing so hard that your sides hurt, and your face is sore the next day. Those times are simply the best.

As I have sat and processed the retreat weekend, I realized there is another constant, unchanging thing: the unexpected surprises of the Lord. I went to the retreat with a heart posture of wanting to pour out and into others. I expected to be so tired when I got home that I would be in bed by 5pm, but I wasn't. I began to see that as I listened or just sat with some of the participants, that was me pouring into them. As I did that, the Lord poured into me. Instead of this "duty" as a leader, the Lord showed me being at the retreat was a privilege. He even answered some of my own personal questions with Scripture or in worship. Oh, and let's not forget the unexpected surprise of the beautiful weather we were blessed with!

The Sunday morning time of sharing is so amazing because when participants get up to give their "shout out" to one another, you can see the change that's happened in them. The same man or woman who said "yes" and laid their idol down for the Lord is now radiant and joyful. For some, they are still grieving the loss, but the deep peace and change is still evident. When asking them how they are, a similar reply comes from each one: "Something's different."



Without fail, I come home from the PF retreat amazed, and to my surprise, refreshed. I am grateful to be able to witness the changes the Lord makes to those who say "yes" to Him. I am also grateful to be a part of this ministry and to walk arm in arm with the other leaders. The last thing I hope never changes is the work the Lord does at the Portland Fellowship retreat. Year after year, because of the Lord's transformation that takes place, the TBG retreat is still amazing. "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:36)
